

#### Medical Student Committee

The AWS National Medical Student Committee continues to support and elevate female medical students interested in surgery, with the ultimate goal of improving diverse representation and equity within surgery. The 25'-26' medical student committee is composed of 28 highly dedicated and talented medical students from around the world.

This year, our committee's overarching goals are to:

- Enhance our national chapter toolkit to provide comprehensive guidance and support to chapters worldwide
- Foster robust collaboration with identity focused partner surgical societies especially on diversity focused initiatives
- Re-envision our committee workflow to foster collaboration on major projects, strengthen inter-committee relationships, and elevate national committee roles to ensure sustainable, high-quality performance
- Promote cross-committee collaboration within AWS to advance key initiatives and deliver measurable impact

Our committee designs, organizes, and implements numerous annual projects that engage medical students throughout the world. These include the Dorothy Brown & Maria Garcia Sancho Surgical Mentoring Program, Starr Research Forum held at the annual conference, Knots for Thoughts podcast, National AWS Medical Student Journal Club, National Day of Service virtual event for K12 URM high school students, in-person K12 outreach event for BIPOC high school girls at the annual conference in collaboration with SBAS, Instagram live events for heritage months celebrating the diversity in surgery, in-person student reception at the annual conference, quarterly zoom events on various topics relevant to a career in surgery, and 14 regional yearly conferences throughout the world. We currently have over 200 active AWS chapters around the world and continue to grow.

All of our projects have grown and improved throughout the years and continue to be highly successful. We have to-date paired over 250 medical students with mentors and have reached 50+ high school students just in the past year through our various programming. We have also released 8 podcast episodes with more

underway with guest speakers and have successfully continued the national journal club. Our Starr Research Forum continues to be a highly sought-after event at the annual conference and showcases the excellent work of 11 medical students and 10 residents with the highest-scoring abstracts. Our virtual events via social media and Zoom continue to grow in attendance and serve as an excellent way to connect with students throughout the country. Many of our regional conferences now feature research presentations to foster innovation, knowledge exchange, and professional growth among attendees. Our social media presence has also hugely grown, and we now have our own dedicated posting times on Instagram where we will be sharing more about the medical student initiatives and stories within AWS, as well as the growth of region-specific Instagram presence, highlighting regional and local initiatives.

New this year, we look forward to enhancing our national chapter toolkit to streamline AWS chapter initiation, growth, and renewal, while ensuring clear communication of the processes needed to achieve these goals. We are also eager to develop a centralized database to capture and consolidate successful NMSC initiatives, providing future members with proven strategies to support their success and growth. We will be continuing to refine and implement our IMG-specific mentorship program. Our team is currently evaluating the outcomes of our mentorship program and journal club through ongoing research projects, with hopes of improving the program in future years based on the feedback received. We will also be expanding our resources and podcasts to include guest speakers who also have their own podcasts and focus on topics such as common situations encountered by women on the wards, perspectives from current DEI leaders in surgery, being international in medicine, etc.

We have a schedule for monthly submissions to AJS for "My Thoughts" papers, facilitated by Caitlin Hicks. The topics are discussed and

selected from committee member ideas on current topics affecting Women in Surgery. A few include Redefining Academic Surgery, What to Do with Your First Paycheck, Article Processing Fees and NIH Funding Changes.

Over the past year, we have had quarterly webinars including "How to Teach Effectively," "How to Meet Effectively with Leadership," "Ergonomics," and "Preparing for Fellowship." In December, we hope you can join our Webinar Collaboration with the Resident Committee on "Branding as a Surgeon: Finding One's Niche and Showcasing Personal Skills."

There are several other projects in progress, including the continuation of a series on Women with Resilience, Emotional Intelligence, and Surgical Innovators. New topics include Surgical Lifestyle and its Effect on Family; Speak Up Culture on the Weaponization of Patient Safety Reporting, Conferences in States with Comprehensive Pregnancy Care, Fertility Preservation, and starting a project on Artificial Intelligence and Ethics in Surgery.

#### **Resident & Fellow Committee**

The AWS Resident and Fellow Committee continues to support surgical trainees through education, mentorship, and advocacy, with the ultimate goal of expanding opportunities, enhancing resources, and fostering a strong, connected community among residents and fellows in surgical specialties.

This past year has been one of tremendous growth and impact for our committee. We held consistent monthly calls, which served as a collaborative platform to share ideas, launch initiatives, and build connections across trainees of different institutions and training levels. We also continued our bi-monthly webinar series, which has become a cornerstone of our programming. Each session addressed critical challenges facing surgical trainees, attracting participants from across the country and abroad. Highlights included discussions on fertility preservation and family planning in surgical training, strategies in crafting your research years, parental leave in surgery, navigating the intern year, shaping a surgical career, and contract negotiations.

To extend the reach of these educational sessions, we partnered with the AWS Blog Committee to create companion blog posts summarizing key takeaways and linking to resources. This year, the committee also started writing manuscripts for academic publication on topics such as fertility preservation and supporting trainees through their fertility journey, reflecting our commitment to both advocacy and scholarship.

New initiatives included the launch of a monthly Resident and Fellow's Corner in the AWS newsletter, offering tips, highlights, and curated resources tailored to surgical trainees. A welcome packet for newly matched residents is also in development to support the transition into residency and connect trainees with AWS resources early in their surgical careers. Collaboration has remained central to our mission. This year, we partnered with the Medical Student Committee to comentor journal club presentations, moderate discussions, review abstracts for the
